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## Quick Nine Patch Method

EACH STRIP SET MAKES 5 NINE PATCH BLOCKS

## Step 1

Combine $2 \frac{1}{1} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 44^{\prime \prime}$ dark strip (A) and $1-2^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime} 44^{\prime \prime}$ light strip (B).
See diagram for placement.
Make one strip set. Press toward dark.

Step 2
Sew $1-2^{1 / 2}$ "x $28^{\prime \prime}$ dark strip (D) to light side of strip set. Add $1-2^{1} / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 14$ " light strip (E) to dark side of strip set. See diagram for placement.
Press toward dark.

Step 3
Cut 10-2½"units from dark/light/dark end of strip set and $5-2 \frac{1}{2}$ "units from light/dark/light end of strip set.


Step 4
Join units together to make 5 nine patch blocks.

Quilter Basics

- Please read all instructions before beginning.
- Label your cut pieces
- All instructions use 1/4" seam allowance.
- Press all seams toward dark fabric.


## Cutting

If you are making this quilt using a Moda kit, refer to the color chart on the back page of this pattern to sort and label the strips from the custom Jellyrolls"'included in the kit. Then skip to directions for cutting setting and corner triangles and the border strips.

Please follow the cutting directions below ifyou are not using a kit.
Nine Patch Strips - 63 total. Label strips.
Cut $2-2 \frac{1}{2}$ "x WOF strips from Fabrics 1-25 - except \#12, 13, 14, 24 and 25. Cut 4 strips each from \#12, 13,14, 24 and 7 strips from \#25.
Note: Fabrics \#1 and \#20 are the same. Cut 4 strips total... 2 for lights and 2 for darks.
Alternate Squares - 64 total - kit includes precut squares
From the $2 \frac{1}{8}$ yard cut of the border/background fabric cut:
$11-61 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime} \times W O F$ strips
Subcut $64-61 / 2 " x 6^{1 / 2}$ " squares for alternate blocks


Borders, Corner and Setting Triangles - See diagram below
From the 3 yard cut of the border/background fabric,

## First

Cut $1-93 / 4 \mathrm{xWOF}$ strip
Subcut 4-93/4"x93/4" squares cut twice diagonally for 16 setting triangles
Then
Cut $2-81 / 2$ "x $98^{\prime \prime}$ border strips from LENGTH of fabric for side borders

From Remainder
First
Cut 2-93/4""xWOF strips
Subcut 4-93/4"x93/4" squares cut twice diagonally for 16 remaining setting triangles

Then
Cut 2-81/2"x78" border strips from LENGTH of fabric for top and bottom borders

## From Last Strip

Cut $2-5 \frac{1}{8}$ "x $5 \frac{118 "}{}$ squares cut once diagonally for 4 corner triangles


## Construction - Nine Patch Blocks - Total 85 (need 81)



## Assemble Quilt

$\qquad$
Layout 9 patch blocks into 9 rows of 9 blocks. See quilt image for color placement. Quilt is pieced on the diagonal. Begin and end each row with a setting triangle. Add corner triangles to each corner to complete center of quilt. See Diagram.



## Borders

1. Measure quilt top across top, bottom and through the center. Cut pre-cut top and bottom border strips to that length (approx. $81 / 2 " \times 761 / 2$ " with seams) Add to quilt top. Press.
2. Repeat Step 1 for side borders. Border strips should measure approx. $81 / 2 " x 92^{1} / 2 "$ with seams. Add to sides of quilt top. Press.


## Finishing

Layer, quilt and bind.
A special note about the binding... the narrow binding on the antique quilt was rolled from the back to the front. The kit includes yardage for a separate binding, but please note there is ample fabric included in the backing yardage for a rolled binding if you would like to reproduce the original antique binding.

Fabrics reproduced from circa 1830-40's nine-patch chintz quilt from Pennsylvania. Original quilt is in the Howard Marcus Collection.
